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Suggested Itinerary.

This is a suggested itinerary for a wedding with a ceremony at 4.00 pm.
Please adjust the times relative to the actual time of your ceremony.

- 2.30 I arrive at the address where you are getting ready.
(Try to make sure your hair & make up are finished by about 2.15 pm so that you have time to put on your dress and relax for a few minutes.)
We spend about an hour on photos of you, your bridesmaids and parents if they are going to be there.
If the location is not suitable for photography we will need your cars to be there so that we can travel to one that is.
- 3.30 I leave you for the ceremony.
- 3.45 I spend a few minutes taking photos of the groom and the groomsmen before you arrive. (This is assuming that you are not getting ready at the same address.)
- 4.00 I photograph your arrival and the ceremony and then do the family group photos immediately following the ceremony. I usually start these with a photo of everyone there.
- 5.00 We depart the ceremony for a location or two with the bridal party. This can be somewhere close by or anywhere you like within a reasonable distance. (I recommend we make final decisions about the locations on the day as the best choices will depend on weather and lighting conditions. I also suggest you bring a picnic or at least some nibbles or fruit and drinks with a couple of nice Champagne glasses for use in photos and a picnic blanket.)
There should be time here for you to relax, have a drink and touch up your make up before we start shooting again.
- 6.15 We arrive at your reception. You make your entrance (if you are being introduced formally) and we take a 'fake' cake cutting shot.

An alternative worth mentioning is that I have had a few couples who decided to have all the location photography (three hours), including the full bridal party photos, before the ceremony (not minding that the groom saw the bride in her dress). This allowed them to go straight from the ceremony to the reception without keeping their guests waiting in between.

Please remember, this is just my suggested itinerary. It's your wedding and it should go the way you want it to so that you enjoy yourselves. I don't want you to feel that you have been pressured into something you didn't want to do or missed something that was important to you.
